In the new body of workI have been very focused on building up the surface of paint, and scraping awayor removing layers to reveal what lies beneath and then painting over that andscraping and removing layers again. It is an act of excavation, painting, erasing, scraping, washing away, and painting again to create something new.

My paintings are the results of working free and wide open, and they exemplify my work at expression, exploration, and discovery.
